Salt tolerance definitions:

X High - Takes salt water at roots and foliage, typically the first line of vegetation at shoreline.

High - Takes salt spray at foliage, typically at elevated beach locations.

Medium - Takes occasional salt drift from winds, typically on leeward side of shoreline
 and intracoastal locations.

Low - No salt drift, typically inland or protected area of coastal locations.

Drought tolerance definitions:

X High - Watering only occasionally once well-established.

High - Watering no more than once weekly once well-established.

Medium - Needs watering twice weekly once well-established.

Low - Needs watering three times or more weekly once well-established.
